

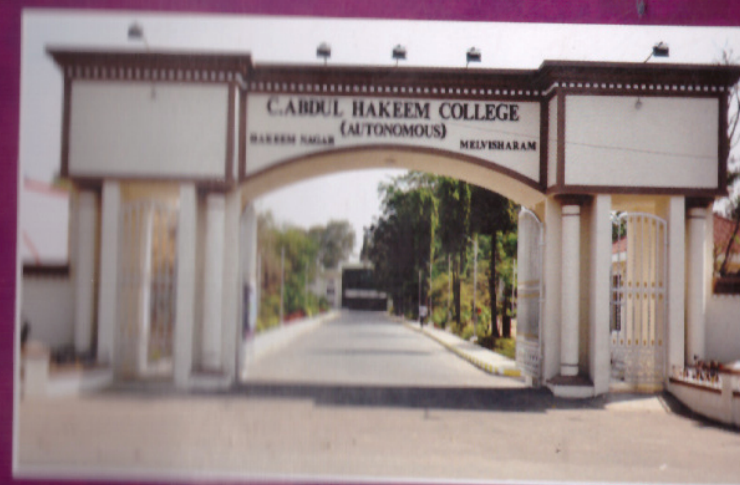

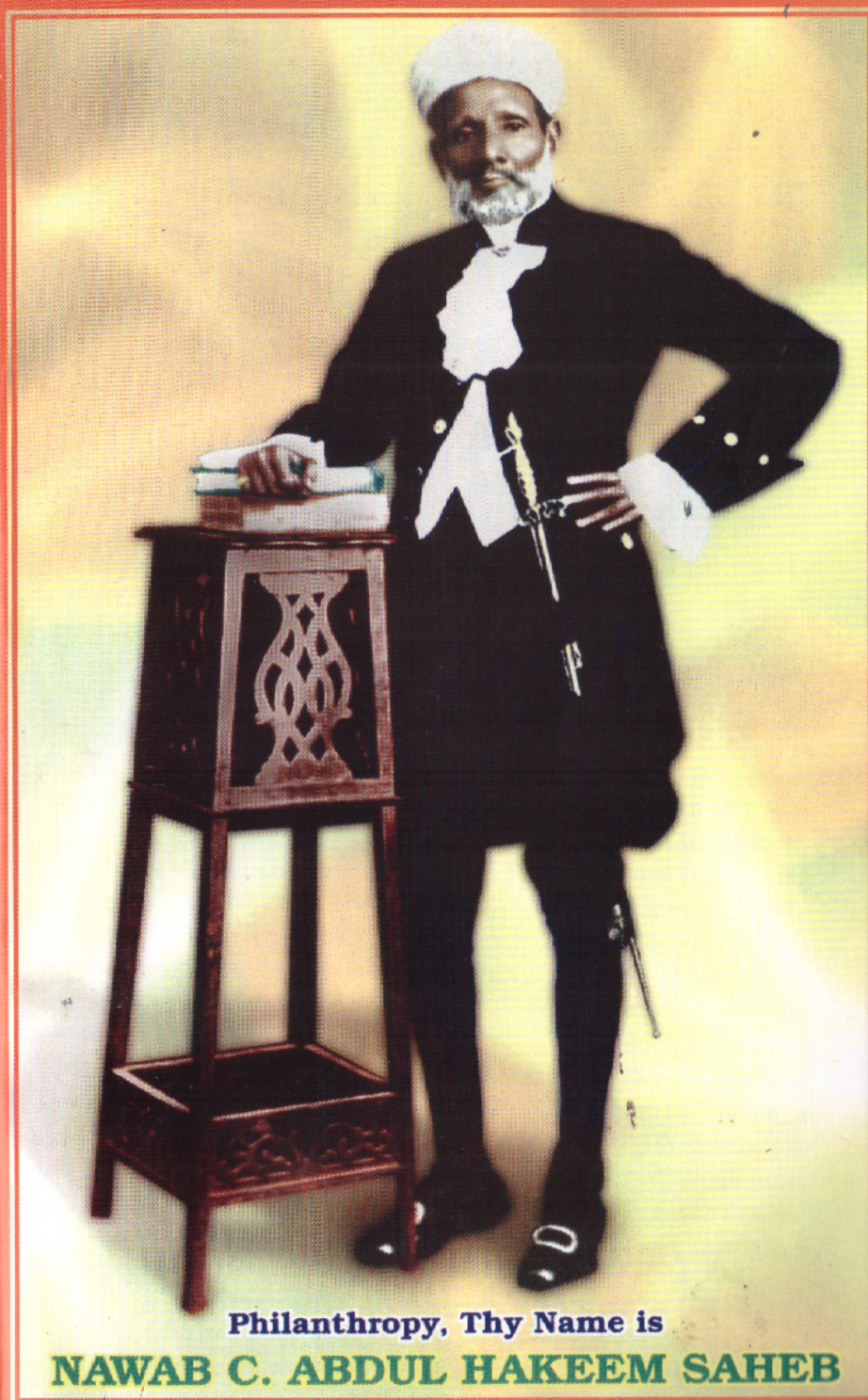

### MORE INFORMATION ABOUT FEES

1. Fee structure is likely to be changed as per the directives of the Govt. of Tamil Nadu.
2. In addition to the fees, each UG and PG Student has to pay to the University (a) Rs.10/ and (b) Rs.25/- towards the Cultural & Youth Festival Fees and towards the development of infrastructural facilities.
3. Students joining the College from other Universities after passing H.Sc. Exam of other States or similar Exams conducted by accredited statutory agencies, shall pay the Recognition fee of Rs. 175/-
4. Students who are admitted in the U.G. Courses are to pay Rs. 50/- per Statement of Marks, as verification fees, together with three xerox copies of each Statement of Marks.

### PAYMENT OF FEES

The Academic Year, for all purposes shall be divided into TWO SEMESTERS. The ODD SEMESTERS beginning with the reopening of the college after summer vacation (June) and ending with 31<sup>st</sup> October of the year, and the EVEN SEMESTERS beginning in the month of December of the year.

Every student is liable to pay the whole fees, Semester wise, during any part of which his name is found on the rolls of the College.

If a student fails to pay the fees by the 5th working day from the beginning of each Semester, a fine of Rs. 5/- shall be levied. If the fee is not paid within 15 days, his name shall be struck off the rolls and if re-admitted, he, in addition to the fees and fines due from him, shall pay the Re- Admission Fee of Rs. 10/-

Students should stand in queue at the office counter while paying the fees.

Students should take receipts for all payments they make and preserve them carefully for future reference.

Students who discontinue their studies at any time during a

Semester have no right to claim remission of any portion of the Semester or other fees paid by them.

Students should put in their claims for refund of deposits before the end of the respective year.

### FEE CONCESSIONS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Full Fee Concession is granted to S.C. and S.T. students.

A number of Scholarships are awarded annually to deserving students based on the results of the previous examination they appeared. These Scholarships are tenable for the period of the entire Course on condition that student's character, conduct and academic records continue to be satisfactory.

List of Scholarships : (i) Backward Class Scholarships , (ii) Adi-Dravidar Scholarships, (iii) Fee Concession Under 92, (iv) Merit Scholarships, (v) National Loan Scholarships, (vi) Scholarships for Handicapped Students and sons of Freedom Fighters, Military Personnel and Beedi Workers.

Only those students who put in 75% attendance are eligible for the Scholarships, as per the Govt. Order.


The following categories of students, irrespective of their caste, are eligible for respective Scholarships and Fee Concession:

- (i) Handicapped Students,
- (ii) Sons and Dependents of Freedom Fighters,
- (iii) Sons and Dependents of Service Personnel,
- (iv) Sons and Dependents of retired or skilled Service Personnel and
- (iv) Sons of Teachers died while in service.

Application for all these Scholarships in the prescribed forms should be submitted to the Principal on or before 31st August, every year.

The following Certificates should be produced in the prescribed forms available in the College Office at the time of applying for Fee



- 
- a) A Declaration Certificate by the parent or guardian.
  - b) A Certificate of Income signed by an Officer of the Revenue Department.
  - c) Converts to Christianity are eligible for the Concession and have to produce, Certificate of conversion in the prescribed form obtained from the Officer who is competent to issue the Income Certificate.

The concessions granted are liable to be withdrawn in all cases of misconduct such as resorting to or participation in strikes, etc.

**Note:** Students desirous of obtaining fee concessions should apply for them with necessary Certificates on or before the 10<sup>th</sup> of October of that particular year. Applications submitted after that date will not be considered.

### ISSUE OF CERTIFICATES - RULES

#### CERTIFICATES FROM THE COLLEGE

A notice of 2 days is necessary for the issue of any Certificate. Students must apply to the Principal for the following Certificates :

  3. Course Certificate : Rs.50/-
- A search fee of Rs. 20/- will be charged in case of application made one year after leaving the college.
4. Duplicate ID Card : Rs. 100/-

2. Provisional (Pass) Certificate can be obtained only from the university on payment of the prescribed fee.

#### RULES OF ATTENDANCE

1. No student shall absent himself from the college without submitting the leave letter. All the leave applications should be endorsed by the parent or guardian and recommended by the concerned Head of the Department. Leave will ordinarily be granted when it is applied in advance, and only for valid reasons. In case of sickness and other unavoidable circumstances extending beyond three days, the Principal or the Registrar of Attendance may require the production of Medical or other Certificates from the student.
2. Application for leave from students residing in the College Hostel should be recommended by the Deputy Warden.
3. Those who are late by more than 5 minutes will not be permitted to enter the class except on valid reason.
4. A student requiring leave for a period or a portion of a period must get permission from the Lecturer, in person, before the class begins.
5. A student absenting himself without leave during a period of the day will be considered as absent for half a day. Absentees for a period or session shall be fined Rs. 5.00. Absentees for a period in the F.N. session and a period in the A.N. session shall be marked absent for the whole day and shall be fined Rs. 10.00.
6. A student absenting himself for 3 days and more shall be fined at the discretion of the Principal, and it will be intimated to the parent.
7. A student who continuously absents himself for 15 days without a valid reason will have his name struck off the rolls.
8. Dropping away at the end of a semester or late return after



holidays shall be punishable with heavy fines.

9. Absence from tests, composition and special classes shall be severely dealt with and heavy fines will be collected.
10. Absconders from class and habitual absentees shall be dealt with severely. The punishment may involve suspension or removal from the college.
11. A student who puts in at least 75% of attendance shall be allowed for the University Examinations. A student who puts in 65% to 75% of attendance will be allowed to take up the Examinations, only at the discretion of the Principal after payment of Condonation Fee.
12. Students who have failed to put in at least 65% of attendance will not be permitted to appear for the University Examinations.
13. A student who secures less than 65% attendance but 55% and above, in any semester has to compensate the shortage in attendance in the subsequent semester besides earning the required percentage of attendance in that semester and take the Examination of both the semester papers together at the end of the latter semester, **only after the payment of Condonation Fee.**
14. A student who secures less than 55% of attendance in any semester will not be permitted to take the regular examinations and to continue the study in the subsequent semester. **He has to re - do the course by rejoining the semester in which the attendance is less than 55%**
15. A student who secures less than 65% of attendance in the final semester has to compensate his attendance shortage in a manner to be decided by the Head of the Department concerned after rejoining the course.
16. The above rules are also applicable to the Practical Classes.





## CONTINUOUS INTERNAL ASSESMENT (CIA)

### EXAMINATION I AND II

Centralized Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) Examinations I and II will be conducted in every Semester. The students are advised to take this Examination very seriously. Marks secured in this Exam will be added to the marks secured in the semester Exam. No re-exam will be conducted for those who secured low marks. If any student fails to attend the CIA exam, he will have to pay a fine of Rupees 100/- for each paper.

### GENERAL CONDUCT OF STUDENTS

1. Every student shall be dressed decently.
2. When the teacher enters the classroom, students shall stand and remain standing till they are asked to sit.
3. No student shall leave the classroom without the permission of the teacher, or until the teacher leaves the room, or asks the class to disperse.
4. Students shall not make any noise while moving from class room to classroom / Labs.
5. No student is allowed to enter the College Office without proper permission.
6. Any damage by the students to the college / hostel property will be made good and those responsible for such damage shall be dealt with severely. Collective fines will be imposed for any such damage when the individual who has done the damage is undetected.
7. Students taking part in communal or political activities will be severely dealt with. They will forfeit the Scholarships and other benefits extended to them.
8. Students are expected to read notices put up on the College

Notice Board and Department Notice Board. Ignorance of any notice thus put up will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with it.

9. Students guilty of adopting unfair means in the Examination will be dealt with severely.
10. Any lost property found must be handed over to the Lost Property Officer, from whom the owner can claim it after proving his ownership.
11. Students are expected to behave well inside and outside the college in such a way to maintain the good name of the college as well as their own.
12. The names of students whose behaviour, in the Judgment of the Principal or any other College Authority, is undesirable or has unwholesome influence on others shall be struck off the rolls without assigning any reason.
13. Students are not allowed to loiter in the corridor during class hours.
14. No Student of the college shall be a member of any Association unconnected with the college without the prior permission of the Principal, nor shall a student take part in any anti-social and subversive activities. The student contravening these rules is liable to be sent out of the college summarily.
15. Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the prior permission of the Principal.
16. Students shall aim at conducting themselves in a manner thoroughly worthy of the Alumni of the college and of the University and in harmony with the traditions of national life and culture.
17. Cases of improper behaviour, or default in the matter of payment of College Fees, Fines or Hostel dues will entail such disciplinary action as the Principal may deem fit.
18. 'RAGGING' of any kind is not permitted either inside the



**College Campus or in the Hostel or outside. Students who are guilty of the offence will be dismissed from the College and handed over to the Police authorities for further action, as per the Govt. Orders.**

19. Students who travel by bus have to show due respect to the bus- crew, ladies, elderly persons and teachers.
20. Students are advised not to bring or use cell phones in the college. Such of those students who violate this rule will be dealt with seriously.

**Note:** Under the Government Educational Rules, the Principal has full powers to inflict the following punishments :  
Levy of Fines, Withholding of Certificates, Suspension and Expulsion.

#### **CYCLE AND TWO - WHEELER STAND**

All cycles and two-wheelers are expected to be parked in the stand according to the numbers allotted to them, after getting them registered in the office. While leaving the vehicles, students must take the token from the watchman and surrender it to him without fail when they take their vehicles back.

Books, Tiffin Carriers, etc., should not be left in the stand along with the vehicle.

Students must take care to see that their vehicles are left locked in the stand. If a vehicle is not registered or found outside the stand, a fine of Rs. 10/- will be levied.

#### **MALPRACTICES IN THE EXAMINATIONS AND CORRESPONDING PUNISHMENTS**

The students indulging in any form of Malpractice will be given punishment as per the details furnished below and as per the guidelines given by the Tamil Nadu State Council for Higher Education:

1.	Possession of copy material in any part of the body or on the desk or on any object like scale, calculator etc.	All the answer scripts of the student in the Semester Examination concerned will be cancelled.
2.	Copying from any of the above.	All the earlier written examinations of the student in the Semester concerned will be cancelled and he will be debarred for one or two more Sessions.
3.	Helping other students for copying or getting copy material from others in the Examination Hall.	Student's answer book pertaining to the Paper concerned will be cancelled and he will be debarred for one more Session.
4.	Insertion of answer-sheets brought from outside.	All the Papers answered by the student will be cancelled and he will be debarred for two or three years.
5.	Taking away the answer-script without handing it over to the Invigilator.	All the Papers answered earlier by the student in the Semester Exam concerned will be cancelled.
6.	Manhandling or abusing the Personnel concerned with the Examination Section of the College or the Inspection Squad or the External Additional Chief Superintendent.	All the Papers answered by the student in the Semester Exam concerned will be cancelled and he will be debarred for the next three years.
7.	Impersonation	The Whole Exam taken by the student will be cancelled and he will be debarred for the next three years.
8.	Tampering with Hall-Tickets.	Student will not be permitted to appear for any Examination for two years.
9.	Committing malpractice for the second time.	The whole Examination taken by the student in the Semester concerned will be cancelled and he will be debarred for the next two years.
10.	Malpractice in Practical Examinations.	All the Written Papers of the Student in the concerned Semester Exam will be cancelled and he will be debarred for two subsequent Examinations.

**Note : Students are strictly instructed not to indulge in any form of Malpractice.**



### **CERTIFICATE FOR RAILWAY CONCESSION TICKETS**

Students should apply in writing for Railway Concessional Ticket Certificates at least two days in advance, only to go to their native place during vacation and terminal holidays.

### **PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

Every student shall be required to undergo the physical training prescribed or recognized by the College and his annual attendance and progress certificates will not be complete unless the Principal certifies to the effect that the candidate, in addition to usual course of instruction, has satisfactorily undergone the prescribed course in physical training and put in three - fourths of the attendance.

The physical training prescribed by the college and certified by the Principal includes these activities:

- (i) Physical training meant for NCC Cadets
- (ii) Field sports or games and
- (iii) Formal physical exercises.

Alternatives (ii) and (iii) shall be pursued for not less than two periods of at least 45 minutes duration each, per week.

No student shall be exempted from physical training unless he is declared by the Medical Officer of the college to be unfit to undergo the training.

### **ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION**

All the students of the college are members of the Athletic Association. The Director of Physical Education is Ex-Officio Vice - President of the

Association.

The Association shall be managed by a sports Council. The Association shall arrange tournaments and other competitions.

Provision is made on the campus for the following games:

### **NATIONAL CADET CORPS**

The NCC offers opportunities for military training to University students, without imposing on them any obligation for active Military Service. The objectives of NCC are the improvement in physical and mental alacrity, cultivation of a sense of pride in smart turnout and bearing, fostering a sense of discipline and responsibility, development of social personality and aptitude for leadership and inculcation of the principles and practices of military service. Members of the Corps have no liability for military service but have definite obligation for regular training.

- i. Attendance at weekly Parades held during the year.



Note : Parades will not interfere with the academic work and come to a close in about three weeks before the Examinations.

- ii. Cadets will have two Parades a week, each of two hours duration.
- iii. Every Cadet undertakes to continue in the Corps until discharged, or on leaving the college or on approved medical grounds.
- iv. Every Cadet on discharge, will be issued a Discharge Certificate which will carry weight with those responsible for recruiting to the Government or other Services.
- v. Government Uniform which should be worn in all parades on the campus is issued free to all Cadets.
- vi. The uniform and other stores issued to the Cadets shall be returned to the N.C.C. Officer, in a clean, washed and pressed condition, on the last Parade day of the year or when the Cadet discontinues from N.C.C / College or when the Officer demands.

#### **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME**

The National Service Scheme was introduced by the Govt. of India in 1969 - 70 in select Universities all over the country. This Scheme has worked out miracles. Greater stress is now being laid on the involvement of students in constructive and developmental programmes, particularly in the rural areas.

The general objectives of this Scheme are, (i) to serve the community while undergoing instruction in an educational institution, (ii) to arouse the social conscience of students, (iii) to provide them with an opportunity to work with the people around the educational campuses, creatively and constructively and (iv) to put the education they receive to concrete social use.

400 volunteers are being enrolled in our college. Enrolment is made at the commencement of each Academic Year. Students who desire to join this Scheme should report personally to the Programme - Officers in the N.S.S. Office.

### LIBRARY

1. On working days, the library will be kept open from 8.30 a.m. to 6.00 p.m.
2. The Library will be closed on weekly and all Govt. Holidays.
3. It will be kept open during terminal holidays and summer vacation.
4. Students are entitled to keep the books for a fortnight from the date of issue. If the books are not returned on or before the due date, a fine of Re. 1/- per day will be levied. Students will not be allowed to use the Library till the fine is paid and the books returned. Books due on holidays may be returned without fine on the subsequent working day.
5. No student is allowed to sub - lend the books borrowed by him from the library.
6. Students on receiving the books, should examine them and report to the Librarian if any damage is found therein, otherwise, they will be held responsible for any damage that may be detected afterwards.
7. Absence from the college will not ordinarily be accepted as an excuse for delay while returning books.
8. All payments including fine shall be paid in the college office and the receipt should be shown to the Librarian.
9. The Librarian may recall any book at any time even if the normal period of lending has not expired.

### BOOK BANK

With the assistance of UGC, a Book Bank is functioning in the college for the benefit of poor students. Such students are advised to contact the respective Heads of Departments for the books they need.

### GENERAL INFORMATION

There is no Student Union in the college and hence no election to it. 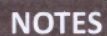
